REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH

To the Officers and Residents of the Town of Acushnet:

The Board of Health submits the following report for the year ending December 31, 1935.

Immediately following the annual election the Board of Health met and organized as follows:

Chairman—Joel P. Bradford.

Secretary—Alexander Newton.

Inspector of Licenses and Agent—Charles Dietz.

Allen E. Weeks was re-appointed Inspector of Slaughtering and was duly sworn into office.

The results of the toxin-anti toxin treatment for the prevention of diphtheria have been further marked by not having one case of diphtheria reported for the year 1935.

A marked increase was shown in the number of tubercular patients although only one had a settlement in this town. We realize that the early diagnosis and segregation of tubercular patients is our only hope of ever reducing this disease which is responsible for more deaths than any other one disease.

We desire at this time to call the attention of residents within the territory bounded by Main Street on the north, South Main Street on the east, Prouteau Street on the south, and the Acushnet River on the west, that this territory is closed to the keeping of swine unless a special permit is obtained from the Board of Health. This legislation was enacted several years ago but recently has been neglected. Several complaints came to the Board of Health and we found very unhealthy conditions existing.

During the past few years our residents have more and more failed to report to the Board of Health ordinary contagious diseases in their household thereby exposing unnecessarily the school children.

We would urge that all parents or other persons knowing of the presence of any contagious disease should notify the Clerk of the Board of Health in the Town Hall which is not only their legal obligation, but a benefit which is due to their neighbors.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Acushnet School Committee and
Citizens of Acushnet:

I respectfully submit my fourth annual report as Superintendent of the Acushnet School System.

As I look back over the year 1935 I find much to feel satisfied with. Many favorable changes have developed which tend toward a more compact and educationally efficient School System. A truly progressive School Department demands close supervision in its administration. Never before has there been such rapid evolution in standards and ideals. As conditions change so too must education keep abreast of the times. The old must perforce make way for the new.

In March 1935 the elimination of classes on the Town Hall floor was an important factor in improving our schools. There has been added strength in pupil development as a result. Uniformity in textbooks has been a watchword in all four schools. The Elson Basic Reading Series has been completed in all grades. This textbook is superior in every sense of the word and is a boon to every child. In the first three grades correlated workbooks are provided as supplements to the text. New Series in English are in use and it is certain that the near future will see a complete installation of a recent textbook. Geography and History are greatly enhanced by modern texts and supplements. Mathematics and Science books have been added which insure effective results. The textbook field is ever fertile and keen satisfaction is derived in the selection of new material.

Workbooks directly pertaining to the respective major subjects are in use. I stand behind the use of individual workbooks because experience has shown they are invaluable in

teaching the pupils how to study. No learning can take place without doing; knowing how to do is a prime requisite.

Accomplishments of our eighth grade graduates were fine at the end of the November quarter in the Normandin Junior High School. No delinquent slips were handed to any Acushnet youngster. This fact in itself means better preparedness for secondary education. Without raised standards this smooth progression could never be maintained. An eighth grader must necessarily be fully prepared to enter high school before the honor of receiving a diploma is bestowed upon him. Sound reasoning suggests that a person who is qualified to continue his education in high school should do successful work at the New Bedford Vocational School or the Bristol County Agricultural School. A sense of security is gleaned in the knowledge that pupils leaving the Acushnet Schools for higher institutions have the capacity to go on with the learning process.

Under the P. W. A. and E. R. A. fine renovations were made in the cellars at Mason W. Burt School and Long Plain School respectively. Excavations were dug under each school and new cement walls were constructed which greatly improved the basements. There is now ample room for storage and materials.

In 1935 the eight week system of vacation periods following the Christmas holidays was adopted. Under this system there are two vacations from January to the summer recess, usually falling at the end of February and April. Under the former practice there was but one vacation during the entire period. After children have pursued their studies for eight weeks there starts a diminishing utilization of school time which leads to inferior results. Thus, by having a one week interim at the conclusion of each eight weeks the quality of work accomplished remains unimpaired. The change is very much for the better.

The Teachers' Oath of Allegiance was a high light of 1935 in that it precipitated much comment and discussion.

I believe an Oath of Allegiance has its value in the Citizenship field as it teaches respect and loyalty to one's country. Any broad-minded treatment of the States action in this case should show the good features of having children reveal their allegiance by saluting the flag.

Telephones have been installed in all Acushnet Schools. This move has proven its worth in several instances. Telephones are a business-like assurance of greater safety in cases of emergency. In these days of speeding automobiles and terrible accidents, quick means of securing aid are essential. In the administration of the School Department telephones in all schools mean a more rapid solution of the many complex problems which arise daily.

The attendance at the New Bedford Vocational School is much greater this year. The enrollment has increased 50% to 56 students. This means an increase in tuition costs. The Vocational School budget of \$8,600.00 in 1935 was insufficient to cover all expenses. The December 1935 tuition bill of \$652.00 remains unpaid. This amount will have to be appropriated at the March meeting. It is estimated that \$11,300.00 will be required in 1936, this figure to include the unpaid tuition bill. The transportation problems involved in carrying students to the Bristol County Agricultural School have been greatly reduced as a new School Bus is being provided for this purpose. The Rochester School Bus is aiding our cause in transporting 25 Acushnet pupils to the Vocational School.

The School Department Budget requirements for 1936 are estimated at \$46,500.00. This figure is \$500.00 lower than in 1935 and represents the lowest School expense in thirteen years! Much waste has been eliminated in the operation of the Schools and costs have been decreased \$11,500.00 since 1932. This saving is certainly a great contribution to the effort of lowering Town Appropriation Costs.

The Trust Fund Commissioners have again aided the Schools in the purchase of worthwhile books and their co-operation has been a source of inspiration.

All School Department employees have been very helpful in promulgating a smooth and efficient administration and their steadfast reliability is keenly appreciated. On behalf of the School Department I wish to express deep regrets at the loss of a true and faithful supporter of the cause of education . . . Mr. Otto W. Melzer.

The Acushnet School Committee has been very diligent in passing rules for the betterment of the School System as a whole and it has been a pleasure to work with such a cooperative Group. In terminating my report I express my sincere thanks for the fine support rendered me by the townspeople of Acushnet.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE FOR 1935

My dear Mr. Ford:

The physical examinations held in our schools during 1935 were very satisfactory. The outstanding defects being enlarged tonsils, glands and poor teeth. I am sorry to say the teeth are in very poor condition generally.

In May, 1935 we had the Tuberculin test given by the State Doctors at which time 56 children were tested. Those who reacted were X-rayed at our regular Chadwick Clinic, held in May, also. Three children were recommended to summer camp in Attleboro. Only two, however, were sent.

We conducted our Diphtheria Toxin Anti-toxin clinic in May with 100% consents from the Mothers. Each year, now, we find it only necessary to immunize the little folks coming into the first grade and many of these are done during the summer at our "Baby and Pre-school Clinic." Diphtheria has been almost entirely eliminated in our town. I do not know of one single case during the year of 1935.

Mumps seemed to be an outstanding epidemic in the fall. In many homes three and four school children were sick with this ailment at the same time.

I wish to thank our school teachers and yourself for your cooperation in helping us to look out for the health and well being of our school children.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to dispose of tax title real-estate purchased or taken in the name of the Town and on which the rights of redemption has been foreclosed as provided under the provisions of Chapter 60, General Laws (ter. ed.) and amendments thereto, or having been deeded to the Town, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the improvement of Perry Street; said money to be used in conjunction with any money which may be allotted by the State or County, or both, for this purpose; or take any other action relative thereto.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to install four (4) Street Lights, one at the corner of Leonard St., one at the corner of Robinson Rd., one at the corner of Lake St., and one at the corner of Quaker Lane and make an appropriation for the maintenance of these four lights. (By petition).
