

Sir:

As directed by you, I have made an audit of the books and accounts of the town of Acushnet for the period from April 6, 1933, the date of the previous audit, to June 20, 1936, and report thereon as follows:

The records of the financial transactions of the several departments receiving or disbursing money for the town, or committing bills for collection, were examined, checked, and verified by a comparison with the reports and the records in the office of the town accountant.

The ledger accounts were analyzed, the appropriations and transfers being checked with the town clerk's records of town meetings and with the records of the finance committee. A balance sheet, showing the financial condition of the town on June 20, 1936, was prepared and is appended to this report. This balance sheet indicates that the town is in very good financial condition.

The books and accounts of the town treasurer were examined and checked. The cash book additions were verified, and the recorded receipts were analyzed and compared with the records of the town accountant and with those of the departments making payments to the treasurer. The payments by the treasurer were compared with the selectmen's warrants authorizing the disbursement of town funds.

The treasurer's cash balance on June 20, 1936, was proved by actual count of the cash in the office and by a reconciliation of the bank balance with a statement furnished by the bank of deposit.

The recorded payments on account of maturing debt and interest were checked with the amounts falling due and with the cancelled securities on file.

The savings bank books representing the investment of the trust funds in the custody of the town treasurer were personally examined and listed, the income being proved and the transfers to the town being verified.

The records of tax titles held by the town were examined and checked. The amounts added to the tax title account were compared with the collector's records. The reported redemptions were checked with the receipts as recorded on the treasurer's cash book, and the tax titles on hand were listed, proved, and checked with the records in the Registry of Deeds.

The books and accounts of the collector of taxes were examined and checked. The taxes and assessments outstanding at the time of the previous examination were audited and all subsequent commitments were added and reconciled with the assessors' warrants for their collection. The payments to the treasurer by the collector were checked to the treasurer's books, the abatements as recorded were compared with the records of abatements granted by the assessors, and the outstanding accounts were listed and proved.

Verification of the outstanding accounts was made by sending notices to a number of persons whose names appeared on the books as owing money to the town, and from the replies received it appears that the accounts, as listed, are correct.

The records of the town treasurer and collector of taxes, and of the town accountant have been neatly and accurately kept, the work of the audit being facilitated thereby. The good financial condition of the town is largely due to the efficient work of the collector of taxes in securing prompt settlement of the tax levies committed to him for collection.

The records of licenses issued by the town clerk and other departments were examined and checked, and the payments to the State and the town were verified.

The surety bonds of the officials required by law to furnish them were examined and found to be in proper form.

The records of departmental accounts receivable were examined. The payments to the treasurer were verified, th abatements were checked, and the outstanding accounts were listed and proved.

In addition to the accounts mentioned, the records of all other departments collecting money for the town or rendering bills for collection were examined and checked in detail.

Appended to this report, in addition to the balance sheet, are tables showing a reconciliation of the treasurer's cash, summaries of the tax, assessment, tax title, and departmental accounts, as well as tables showing the condition and transactions of the trust funds.

For the co-operation extended and the assistance rendered by the several town officials during the audit, I wish, on behalf of my assistants and for myself, to express appreciation.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH

To the Officers and Residents of the Town of Acushnet:

The Board of Health takes pleasure in presenting the following report for the year ending December 31, 1936:

Immediately following the annual election, the newly elected member having been duly sworn into office, the Board met and organized as follows:

Chairman-Joel P. Bradford.

Secretary—Alexander Newton.

Inspector of Licenses and Agent—Charles Dietz.

This organization has continued throughout the year.

Allen E. Weeks was re-appointed inspector of Slaughtering and was duly sworn into office.

The year's work has been in some ways one of the most satisfactory in our experience, as in spite of the results of poor nourishment, clothing and housing incident to the years of depression the total sum of contagious diseases to occur in town has been less than the previous year. Some of our neighboring towns have been gripped with serious outbreaks.

The Board of Health have tried to use every preventative and propholactyc measure possible to prevent contagion and to do its utmost to maintain good sanitary conditions throughout the town.

The matter of supervised town dumps is becoming a more important question each year as the scattering of refuse about town is not only unsightly, but at times becomes an actual menace as a breeding place of flies and rats.

We wish also to call the attention to residents to a regulation of the town in which the keeping of swine is prohibited within a certain area except with special permission of the Board of Health. Such area is bounded by Main Street on the north, South Main Street on the east, Prouteau Street on the south, and the Acushnet River on the west. We have had trouble with swine being brought from outside towns into this area and kept in such quarters as to be a menace to a congested district.

The usual number of complaints have been received and adjusted, and the garbage has been quite satisfactorily collected and disposed of.

Fortunately we have had few tuberculor cases this year so our appropriation was more than ample, but we cannot hope to be so fortunate every year.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Acushnet School Committee and Citizens of Acushnet:

I respectfully submit my fifth annual report as Superintendent of the Acushnet School System.

The year just passed saw many desirable changes for the better as indicated by concrete instances of wholesome growth within the schools. Unity of subject matter throughout has largely been realized. New and modern texts and supplements were adopted during 1936 which have proven their worth.

The latest and more progressive edition of the English text by Sheridan titled "Speaking and Writing English" was installed in all schools in September. Evidence of its superior value is profound. The children like the book and averages in English have improved perceptibly.

A consistent endeavor to provide such major subject texts as are most suitable to the community has been very fruitful. To date the schools possess four new book series in as many subjects—Reading, English, History and Geography. Attention is being given Mathematics and it is anticipated that a new adoption will follow soon in that subject.

A workbook is provided each pupil in each major subject. I favor these workbooks because of their pronounced value in teaching the child how to study. It is all-important that the individual have some system for gleaming information from the book used. A haphazard perusal of pages with no immediate objective usually breeds unpreparedness. The workbook precludes this aimless procedure and insures systematic study.

An indication of real growth may be shown by a statement of what the school children revealed when given the Metropolitan Achievement Test in May. The average accomplishment in all studies of the curriculum in all schools was one month ahead of what it should have been! This achievement was an inspiration to me because it proved beyond any doubt that the pupils were learning properly and were retaining their education satisfactorily. The degree of preparedness with which the individual progresses from grade to grade is the real test of his attainment.

Results shown by Acushnet students attending the Normandin Junior High School in New Bedford were remarkable. With no exceptions all were graduated in June! I hold this achievement before my present eighth graders as a goal toward which they should strive. The pupils are impressed with the necessity for study in order to be able to duplicate this fine progress. I do not assume that all Acushnet children must graduate or fall by the wayside; rather the greater majority of the class earning promotion means stronger educational standards in the town so manifestly interested in its own group. The graduating class of June 1936 at the Normandin Junior High School is to be congratulated in every sense of the word.

Academically the Acushnet schools are functioning smoothly and the boys and girls are deriving a maximum benefit from educational facilities placed at their disposal.

A better spirit seems to pervade the community. The distressing features of the depression are rapidly being eradicated and the outlook appears more desirable. I issued twice as many employment cards in 1936 as in the previous year. This fact alone should warrant optimism.

The estimated 1937 school budget is \$46,300.00. This figure is \$200.00 lower than that of 1936. When one considers that school expenditures have been reduced \$13,700.00 since 1930 the question arises as to how such retrenchment was made. There are five ways in which this curtailment was brought about. School enrollment dropped considerably. Four teachers were automatically removed as a result.

School Department employees were cut over 21% in salaries. The school year was shortened two weeks. Diligent and untiring supervision on the part of the staff in use of school materials contributed in no small way.

Every exercise of efficiency is now evident as results clearly show. Educational standards have strengthened in spite of the fact that the school budget is at its lowest level in fourteen years. It must be emphasized that the structure of this school system cannot survive any further inroads tending to depress expenditure. A bottom limit has been reached. The 1937 school budget will be balanced. However, all things being equal, subsequent yearly budgets must tend upward due to the ever-increasing rise in price of all school materials. This does not imply any lessening of regard for economy but is to be construed as indicative of an indisputable tendency.

It is estimated that Vocational school expenses will approximate \$10,800.00 for 1937. This figure is \$500.00 less than the preceding budget. Vocational Evening School obligations were again assumed in 1936. The cost per year

for this type of education is \$12.00 per person.

Under the provisions of Part 1 of Chapter 70 of the General Laws, which provides State reimbursements on account of the employment of teachers, the sum of \$5,150.00 was credited to the Town of Acushnet. For tuition of State Wards, Chapter 76, General Laws, the reimbursement totalled \$371.66. The State refund on account of Vocational education was \$3,244.30. The Division of Vocational Education pays one-half the tutition costs for attendance at the New Bedford Vocational School.

A glimpse at the age and grade distribution chart for October 1, 1936 shows a better trend because a greater number of pupils falls within normal age limitations than in the previous record. Your attention is also drawn to the reports of the school nurse and school physicianwhich are very well rendered.

Safety patrols have been organized in all the schools. These units are much needed and are doing a creditable work. Both boys and girls take part in supervising the crossing of streets and direction of automobile traffic. The effort is made to keep the children on the sidewalks until movement becomes safe rather than to stop cars. Most drivers are courteous and helpful in this matter but it is unwise to expect a youthful patrol leader to stand on the highway. The members of the Safety patrol wear white traffic belts and are easily recognized by automobile operators. There is real character building in allowing students to shoulder responsibilities of this nature.

I offer my sincere thanks to all school employees for their loyal support and fine cooperation. The Trust Fund Commissioners have been very helpful in providing supplementary textbooks. My association with the School Committee has been very pleasant and a source of inspiration in administrative duties.

The townspeople of Acushnet have shown a steadfast support of their schools which is very commendable. May I extend an invitation to all residents of this town to visit the classrooms often and enjoy the observation of pupils at work.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE FOR 1936

My dear Mr. Ford:

In our physical evaminations this year 774 children including the pupils at the St. Francis Xavier school were carefully examined. Defects were as follows:

Decayed teeth	443
Tonsils	385
Heart	168
Lungs	134
Thyroids and oher glandular conditions	359

From January to May there were three outbreaks of Chickenpox; Measles and Whooping Cough being prevalent also.

Regular clinics were held as follows:

Mental Clinic in February

Chadwick Follow-up Clinic in June.

The Tuberculin Test was administered to all school children, whose parents approved, during the month of October. A large percent took advantage of the offer. Most of those who were X-rayed were found to be free from the Tuberculin Baccilus.

In September Toxin Ante Toxin for Diphtheria was given to all our beginners who wished it. Sixty-three children were vaccinated against Small Pox.

We really believe the general health of our school population has greatly improved this year.

For the information of Citizens of Acushnet the Community Nurse will be available at 224 Main Street from 8.00 to 9.00 A. M. and 1.00 to 2.00 P. M. daily.

Again we wish to thank the school personnel for their hearty cooperation in this work.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL PHYSICIAN

To the School Committee and Citizens of Acushnet:

I respectfully submit the following report as School Physician:

This year's work has been one of the most satisfactory of school years.

We have reached the full benefit of the toxin-anti-toxin treatment for the prevention of diphtheria and have not had a single case of diphtheria appear in school this year. Also the proportion of other communicable diseases has been reduced.

The general physical condition of the children showed markedly the result of the years of poor food, clothing, housing and general poor conditions in improverished systems, undernourishment and lack of resistance which laid the children open to any infection, but which has been kept off.

The work of the baby and pre school clinics has just reached the upper grades in the school and showed very plainly an improved posture and general physical condition. This is very encouraging and helps us to greater care in these works.

I would express my sincere gratitude to the Superintendent and teachers for their active cooperation in our work which has been a very great help and without which our work would have been very difficult.

I again thank the parents, School Committee as well as the faculty for their heartly encouragement and solicit the same for the coming year.
