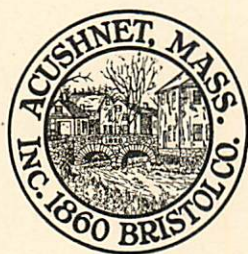

## REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH

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To the Officers and Residents of the Town of Acushnet:

The Board of Health submits the following report for the year ending December 31, 1938:

Immediately following the annual election the newly elected member, Charles Dietz, having been duly sworn into office, the Board of Health met and organized as follows:

Chairman—Joel P. Bradford, M. D.

Secretary—Alexander Newton

Agent and Inspector of Licenses—Charles Dietz

The year's work has been about that of an average year with the usual minor complaints received and adjusted. No serious outbreak of contagious diseases has occurred. We still add another year to our record of no diphtheria in town since introducing the Prophylactic treatment throughout the schools.

An increase in tuberculosis cases have made an added expense and the largest number of cases are now in the hospital than we usually have gives us the outlook of a larger budget next year.

This increase however does not originate in our town but is largely due to out of town cases moving into our town.

The condition of drains and septic tanks has become somewhat annoying and brings a rather disturbing prospect of an impending sewer system that seems too costly for our town. This can be avoided by greater team work of each department as the Health department must have the cooperation of each board and citizen or else the state will certainly oblige the installation of sewers.

One case of typhoid fever was handled in such a way that no spread has occurred.

We trust that the future year may cause a continuance of our previous harmonious execution of our duties and the maintaining of our previous high standard without increased expense.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

To the School Committee and  
Citizens of Acushnet:

I respectfully submit my seventh annual report as Superintendent of the Acushnet School System.

The year 1938 has been fraught with many and varied administrative complexities. Despite the necessity of maintaining a consistent vigilance over expenditures the school budget was balanced at \$48,500.00

I shall sketch as concisely as possible the definite actions taken by the School Board in coping with problems as they materialized during the year.

On February 9, 1938 the Committee voted that all School Department employees should receive their pay bi-weekly beginning with the summer recess. By so doing it was thought that the clerical work involved in issuing checks would be proportionately lessened.

On March 16, 1938 election of officers was held. Mrs. Marion E. Burt was duly chosen Chairman of the Committee. Albert F. Ford was designated as Secretary of the Board.

Realizing that no school system can function well with an excessive annual turnover of teachers the Committee considered at length ways and means of contributing to a diminishing loss

of teacher personnel. Relative to the marriage ruling of May 20, 1936, which stated that teachers who became married thereafter automatically forfeited their positions, the Committee voted on May 18, 1938 as follows:

In recognition of seven, consecutive years of superior teaching in the Acushnet schools by a resident instructor, who has maintained residence in town throughout above specified period, privilege is granted such party to seek approval of Committee to continue teaching in the system after subsequently becoming married. Complete recommendation of Superintendent must accompany request.

This ruling affords the opportunity of retaining the individual who has clearly proven, over a period of years, that he is definitely a boon to the system. It was further stipulated that any individual instructor granted this privilege must remain a resident of Acushnet while continuing membership in the teaching staff.

The School Committee at this point of the year had plans for interchanging the boilers of the Parting Ways School and the Marie S. Howard School. The move, as such, would have been a wise action. However, due to the ever increasing enrollment in outside secondary schools the matter was tabled for future disposition.

At the close of schools in June 1938 it was learned that one of the furnaces at the Long Plain School had run the course of its usefulness and installation of a new heating unit was considered by the Board.

On August 1, 1938 the Committee voted to purchase and install a new Richardson & Boynton furnace at the Long Plain School. Under the able supervision of Edgar B. Cormier, a member of the Board, the work was completed very economically.



On the same date it was noted that several teachers had been elected only to serve one year and then move on to other school systems. In order to preclude this sort of experience the Committee expressed the opinion that all beginning teachers should remain in the Acushnet schools for at least two years before resigning. It was so voted.

In the consideration of the subject of electing teachers the minutes of the past fourteen years were carefully examined to determine if stated policies existed as to necessary qualifications of candidates for teaching positions. Unable to observe any clearout ruling the Committee voted on August 1, 1938 as follows:

No candidate for a teaching position in the Acushnet public schools may be elected without possession of a diploma or degree received from some recognized teacher training institution.

On September 6, 1938 the coal business for the schools was awarded to the A. Ricard and C. A. Toussaint companies.

The resignation of Aime Pepin as regular school bus driver was voluntarily rendered and accepted on September 19, 1938. Joseph C. A. Langevin, Chief of Police, was directed to drive the bus until a new operator was appointed. The Committee suggested that all Police Heads assuming duty in the town of Acushnet should henceforth be substitute school bus drivers insofar as available for the purpose.

Any record of transporting school children safely for over ten years without mishap is an enviable one. Such was the experience of Aime Pepin during his service to the community as bus driver.

On September 28, 1938 Uldric Meunier of 19 Nye Avenue was appointed school bus driver to serve as a regular employee

of the School Department. Meunier is serving well and is very conscientious in the performance of his duties.

During the month of October rumors of dissension were forthcoming in connection with the bus schedule of the Bristol County Agricultural School in Segreganset. Some of the boys were remaining after school in order to practice various games of sport. On many occasions the Acushnet boys did not arrive home from the school until nearly 8 P. M.

After much deliberation the Committee decided that boys, desiring to follow any particular sport involving use of after-school time should assume full responsibility of providing their own transportation. Accordingly, on December 19, 1938, the board recommended that the Segreganset bus be required to leave the Bristol County Agricultural School daily at 3.30 P.M. This arrangement has been very satisfactory and harmony exists in good measure.

Americanization classes have greatly increased their enrollment. In December over sixty-six adults were in attendance. With so many more individuals taking advantage of this type of teaching the Committee found it necessary to add another teacher. On December 19, 1938 the Board duly elected Miss Ruth Taber a teacher of Adult Alien Education to continue service during evident need.

The problem of defraying costs for outside education has assumed formidable proportions. I wish to dwell at length on this subject and point out the many channels through which funds now go for the purpose of educating both young and old beyond the elementary grades which make up the Acushnet school system.

In September 1938 the attendance at the Normandin Junior High School totalled thirty-seven pupils including those eighth grade graduates of the St. Francis Xavier Parochial School who



elected to continue their studies at this institution. Compared with an enrollment of twenty-two in June of the same year it is easily noted that an increase of fifteen students existed. In other words an additional 68% necessarily had to be absorbed in that part of the budget set aside for tuition expenditures.

The monthly rate of tuition at the above-mentioned school is \$12.50. For the four months elapsing from the beginning of September 1938 through December the average cost was \$50.00 for each student. Multiplying this figure times the increase of fifteen it is clear that \$750.00 had to be allotted to the Junior High School costs of education, this amount in excess of ordinary expenses. Supervision of the budget with a view to balancing same on December 31, 1938 became an acute problem.

Dwelling upon the High School situation forty-three students from Acushnet were in attendance in September. Compared with thirty-six in June there was an increase of seven individuals or 19%. Examining costs in this instance it was indicated that a material supplementary sum would be needed beyond ordinary requirements. The yearly tuition rate at the New Bedford High School is \$150.00. Over the ten-month school year the monthly average rate becomes \$15.00. Indulging in the use of a bit of mathematics one observes that the costs per student covering a period of four months, in the fall of each fiscal year, are \$60.00. With the responsibility for paying for seven more youngsters an additional \$420.00 had to be paid for tuition.

From the beginning of January through June of any school year experience has shown that a varying mortality of attendance exists upon which school authorities depend to a great degree in shaping or forecasting needs for secondary school tuition. Youngsters in High School drop out, as home conditions demand, in order to seek direly needed employment. This factor contributes yearly to a gradual lessening of gross tuition expenditures.



By drawing a word picture of the enrollment by grades at both Normandin Junior High School and the New Bedford High School I believe I can point out a situation that has caused some concern to the Committee in planning 1939 costs for tuition. In grade nine there are thirty-five students. Grade ten at the High School accommodates fifteen Acushnet people. Grade eleven has twenty-two of our youngsters. Grade twelve or the senior year is represented by nine students from Acushnet.

Undoubtedly the nine seniors will graduate in June, 1939. However, the question arises as to how many of the thirty-five ninth graders will join the High School ranks. A few may decide to enter Vocational School. With general working conditions as they are it is probable that very few will be fortunate enough to secure employment. Thus the attendance mortality rate should prove to be small. A large majority will continue their secondary school studies. As a consequence the amount of money necessary to cover High School tuition for 1939 will be much more than in 1938.

That item of the budget now labelled tuition not only includes tuition costs in New Bedford schools but encompasses obligations assumed in several other institutions. Four students attend the Fairhaven High School at \$81.00 each. Bills from this school will total \$324.00 during 1939. One youngster is enrolled at the Wareham High School at \$124.00 per annum. One Acushnet individual pursues his studies at the Sol-e-mar Hospital school at \$70.00 per year. When the superintendent issues a work card to a minor between the ages of fourteen and sixteen years the law requires that he attend the Continuation school for one-half day each week providing such a school is maintained by the community in which work is obtained. Two such individuals are going to the New Bedford Continuation schools. The average yearly costs in these cases are \$21.00 per pupil. One notes that \$42.00 will be designated for this purpose.

One boy was sentenced by the court to the Middlesex County Training School at Chelmsford for being an habitual school offender. Yearly costs for this person are \$102.00. Fifteen adults have taken advantage of the opportunity to attend classes at the Evening High School in New Bedford. Charges stand at the rate of \$10.00 for the twenty weeks privilege is extended. Through this channel of outside tuition costs \$150.00 must go during 1939.

Having pointed out the inevitable increase in tuition fees in the High School proper may I draw your attention to the enrollment possibilities at the Normandin Junior High School for the fall of 1939. St. Francis Xavier school officials reveal that fourteen Acushnet pupils are attending grade eight. The public schools have an upper grade enrollment of forty-eight. Thus there will be sixty-two young individuals who will make decisions in the future regarding their continued education. Many will elect to go to the New Bedford Vocational School. Hundreds of students in surrounding towns endeavor to enter this school yearly. As a result facilities of the institution are taxed to the limit to accommodate those who apply for admission. A number of Acushnet applications will be excluded either temporarily or permanently along with a large number from other localities.

Not being successful in desiring to attend the Vocational School the boys and girls will go to Normandin. This group will swell the ranks of those previously enrolled in the ninth grade. Out of the total number of prospective secondary school pupils it is not unreasonable to anticipate that some over thirty-five youngsters will be listed on the rolls of the Normandin Junior High School in the fall of 1939.

The School Committee has minimized to a considerable extent in-town needs in order to allocate more funds to the tuition and transportation divisions of the budget. Transporta-



tion costs will be higher in 1939 in proportion to the added attendance in secondary schools.

During 1938 the sum of \$10,137.23 was spent for tuition purposes. In requesting \$11,900.00 for 1939 in this division I believe the Committee is being very fair because the future may prove that even this large amount might be inadequate. Transportation expenses in 1938 were \$1,846.45. The School Board asks for \$1,925.00 to defray such costs in the coming year. In like manner this is a minimum figure.

The estimated school budget for 1939 totals \$50,600.00. This budget represents an increase of \$2,100.00 over 1938 costs. All of the added amount requested will serve to pay tuition bills for out-of-town education. None of these funds will aid the Acushnet schools.

Sixty boys and girls from this community attend the New Bedford Vocational day school at \$160.00 each per year. Thirty-nine adults are enrolled in the Vocational Evening school classes at \$12.00 on the average per individual for the twenty weeks over which this type of education continues. The Rochester school bus transports between thirty and forty of our students at an annual estimated cost of \$420.00. The driver of the Acushnet bus receives \$624.00 per year as a proportionate salary for transportation purposes. The State of Massachusetts re-imburses the Town of Acushnet one-half of all tuition and transportation costs under the Vocational school budget. Approximately \$500.00 is spent annually for car tickets. Transportation to the Bristol County Agricultural School usually costs \$600.00.

It is my thought that the Committee has been conservative in estimating 1939 Vocational school expenditures at \$12,000.00. Here again the increase in enrollment has demanded the added amount of approximately \$1,000.00 for 1939.



It is sound judgment to recommend in a sincere and honest manner the needs of any Town Department. The School Committee has followed every rule of economy in suggesting that above-mentioned funds will prove to be actual requirements for 1939.

Under provisions of Part 1 of Chapter 70 of the General Laws, which provides State Reimbursements on account of the employment of teachers, the sum of \$5,200.00 was due the Town of Acushnet on November 20, 1938. The Department of Public Welfare, Division of Child Guardianship, reimbursed this Town \$682.62 on September 10, 1938 for State Wards attending the public schools locally. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts reimburses one-half the salaries of certified teachers of the Adult Immigrant. \$52.00 was received by the Town for this type of refund.

The total State Reimbursement was \$5,934.62. As a result the net cost to taxpayers for regular school purposes was \$42,565.38.

For tuition of pupils at the Vocational day and evening classes the State reimbursed the Town \$4,061.30 in May, 1938. The net cost for Vocational education was \$6,958.80.

For the information of the taxpayers those funds received annually from the State tend to offset in varying measure the yearly taxes placed upon this municipality by the Commonwealth.

The schools of Acushnet are functioning in a satisfactory way. The real test of the quality of training offered in any school system lies in the results obtained. I am much pleased with the progress of our graduates in all secondary schools. Our youngsters return with their report cards from time to time and reveal a wholesome enthusiasm in their respective studies. It gives one a profound lift when a former pupil con-

siders his elementary teachers worthy of his confidence and trust. A great majority of the Acushnet graduates appear on many occasions seeking advice and help as they continue their education.

Building responsible citizens is a life work that moves the heartstrings and returns much in the way of dividends of happiness. I am confident that our boys and girls go forth with the right attitude toward their fellow associates and to all vested authority. Law and order in any community rests directly upon the caliber and intellectual power of its citizens. I believe our boys and girls will prove to be strong and upstanding individuals in the local society of to-morrow.

Qualities of honesty and leadership are becoming more and more in demand as our daily life increases in complexity. Certainly the past year has proven both trying and chaotic insofar as both internal and foreign relations have been concerned. Rumors of wars and conflict have beset the entire world. One wonders about the future and what it contains for us who are fortunate enough to live in the United States. I cannot visualize any other eventuality than a victory of the democracies over the dictator nations of the earth. However, world peace will be put to a terrific test before anything resembling world tranquility can be hoped for. We dread the horror of war and wholesale slaughter but sooner or later all attempts at arbitration with European dictators will fail. As long as powerful individuals dream of conquering all nations and allow personal thoughts of self-aggrandizement to rule their lives, the rights of others to liberty and freedom will be in jeopardy.

I am deeply appreciative of the consistent interest in our schools shown by the Trust Fund Commissioners. In excess of \$200.00 is set aside each year for books to be used by the children during their studies. Many valuable workbooks are purchased annually from this fund which serve as helpful supplements to the respective texts.



I sincerely pay my respects to all school employees connected with the Department. The consistent cooperation shown by all has contributed to a great degree to the administration of the Acushnet school system. Without a coordinated spirit of helpfulness no unity of purpose for the public good can long endure. The townspeople of Acushnet may rest assured that they have a teacher personnel in whom they may place the utmost confidence.

In bringing my current report to a close I acknowledge the ready support of an understanding School Committee and the friendly interest of the general public toward the education of its youth.
