### **REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH**

To the Officers and Residents of the Town of Acushnet:

In closing the year 1939 the Board of Health respectfully presents this report and recommendations:

Immediately following the election the new number having been duly sworn in by the Town Clerk, the Board met and organized as follows:

Chairman-Joel P. Bradford, M. D.

Secretary-Alexander Newton

Agent and Inspector of Licenses-Charles Dietz

At the beginning of the year we had an unusual number of cases in Attleboro, but these were reduced so soon that we had a substantial unexpended balance to turn back to the town. We hope that we may be as fortunate this year. The increase of tuberculor cases has caused us some uneasiness, but we hope by constantly sending them to the hospital especially fitted to combat the disease we may ultimately stamp it out. We have had relatively few contagious cases this year and are still free from a case of diphtheria.

The garbage situation and the matter of dumps have been very satisfactory this year and we hope to establish permanent dumps in the near future which will put this question in the same class as diphtheria.

Some misunderstandings arose concerning the R. N. Swift bequest and the district nursing. Through the Probate Court this question has been settled and we trust will continue to be of lasting benefit to our community.

We hope to succeed further in our efforts to extend our surface drains to carry the effluvia from the septic tanks to the river and thus keep free from the expense of sewers for sometime yet.

### **REPORT OF**

### SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Committee and Citizens of Acushnet:

I respectfully submit my eighth annual report as Superintendent of the Acushnet School System.

The year 1939 has been a most challenging and trying administrative period. In the face of overwhelming complexities, both financial and professional, the school budget was balanced at \$49,000.00.

Drawnig your attention to the report of the School Committee for 1938 the estimated school budget for 1939 was originally \$50,600.00. At a meeting in January, 1939 the Finance Committee recommended a reduction of \$1,600.00 approving the figure of \$49,000.00. In like manner the Vocational school budget was pared \$500.00 to \$11,500.00. Voters at the annual town meeting in March appropriated above sums as suggested by the Finance Committee.

Taxpayers were confronted with the appalling possibility of a tax rate increase approximating \$10.00 per thousand. Therefore every conceivable plan to forestall such an eventuality was considered. All heads of local departments were urged to retrench to their utmost in order to get through the year with a minimum expenditure. The realization was evident that the school population might be temporarily embarrassed by a lack of essential supplies. This proved to be the case because so much money had to be allotted to payment of high school tuition and transportation obligations.

Due to the timely assistance rendered by the State the tax rate increase was held to \$2.50 per thousand. Although the school budget was balanced, educational oppportunity within town was seriously impaired through excessive retrenchment in the use of books and supplies. Despite a marked additional secondary school enrollment, the local school system should receive a sufficient financial support to guarantee a reasonable progress. In the following paragraphs I shall endeavor to explain in detail definite trends which demand the expenditure of increasing sums.

School authorities must plan ahead several years in order to determine what policies should best be adopted for the normal functioning of their respective school systems. A pressing current problem is the diminishing attendance mortality in High school. This means that students who would ordinarily enter some phase of industry are remaining in school because employment is not available. The greater the secondary school enrollment the larger the cost for tuition and transportation. In the lower elementary grades the number of pupils is relatively small. The enrollment in grades six, seven and eight is large. This situation is a contributing factor in the continued and gradually growing attendance at the High and Vocational schools. However, it is reasonable to assume that classes will decrease in size in three or four years thus relieving the present crowded conditions in the secondary educational field.

About sixty children will graduate from our eighth grades in June. Twelve pupils in the eighth grade at the St. Francois Xavier Parochial School will supplement this group. This class will be the largest to leave elementary school in nine years. It is readily observed that seventy-two individuals will be making decisions as to higher education during the current school year. Where will they be in September, 1940? Experience suggests that at least forty-five will enter grade nine at the Normandin Junior High School, thus nearly doubl'ng the present enrollment. Perhaps twenty will be admitted to the New Bedford Vocational School. Six or seven will undoubtedly discontinue their studies due to private domestic pressure. Twenty-four students will enter New Bedford High School from Normandin. Eighteen Acushnet people will graduate from High School.

To sum up to the significance of immediate trends I believe that costs for tuition and transportation will mount materially in 1940 and remain more or less constant for three years. After 1942 these expenditures should gradually diminish due to a smaller secondary school attendance.

In order to balance school budgets during the last five years much repair work has been delayed. Attention must be given our school buildings or serious problems may arise. The roof at the Parting Ways School is leaking badly and should be recovered. Inside painting is needed in all schools. The Long Plain School should be painted outside as well as the trim at the Marie S. Howard and Mason W. Burt Schools. Many ceilings should be repaired or replaced because of danger of falling plaster. No real economy can be envolved through a disposition to allow repairs to lag. The longer one desists in such matters the greater the cost when the situation is finally corrected. Therefore more money should be made available in the present budget for repair work.

During recent years there has been little or no replacement of worn textbooks. Many school books are so much beyond mending that they will have to be discarded. Consequently there is an evident necessity to purchase new books to replace the old ones now in use. As previously mentioned in this report school supplies have been reduced to a point which precludes a practical and consistent progress. At least \$1000.00 should be allotted to this purpose during any normal fiscal year. Exactly \$632.35 was spent for supplies in 1939. It is clearly indicated that a dangerous curtailment has been in practice. Intelligent thought presupposes that any organization cannot long endure without tools with which to function. It is my sincere hope that added funds will be forthcoming for the purchase of all types of supplies in order to maintain satisfactory educational standards

With respect to predicted requirements for 1940 I can see no possibility of an appropriation of less than \$52,000.00 to guarantee a reasonable educational opportunity for the youth of this community in the public schools. In the last two years costs for tuition have increased \$3,362.77. This fact is mainly accountable for the growing school budget.

An over-run in the Vocational school budget of \$396.30 was experienced in 1939. Transfer of this sum from the Reserve Fund was approved by the Finance Committee. The cost of Vocational School education was \$11,896.30. Greater day school attendance will cause expenditures for this purpose to increase in 1940. It is estimated that \$13,350.00 will be needed. An itemized estimation follows:

It is to be noted that the state reimburses one-half all tuition and transportation costs under the Vocational education program. In this sense it is more advantageous to the taxpayers for students to continue their education at the New Bedford Vocational School. The Acushnet school bus has served the pupils of this town for eight years. Without mincing words this equipment is worn out and should not be used any longer than necessary. The School Committee has given much time and thought to the selection of a suitable unit to replace the old. With a view to procuring the utmost in modern and safe transportation for the least possible expenditure the School Board advises the purchases of a General Motors school bus chassis with a Wayne, all-steel body attached, same to accommodate 48 passengers. It is further recommended that \$2,300.00 be appropriated for this purpose.

Under provisions of Part 1 of Chapter 70 of the General Laws, which provides State reimbursements on account of the employment of teachers, the sum of \$5,250.00 was due the Town of Acushnet on November 20, 1939. The Department of Public Welfare, Division of Child Guardianship, reimbursed this town \$505.80 from State Wards attending the public schools locally. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts reimburses one-half the salaries of certified teachers of the Adult Immigrant. The Town received \$75.00 for this type of repayment.

Reimbursements received by the Town Treasurer as indicated above totalled \$5,829.80. As a result the net cost to taxpayers for regular school purposes was \$43,170.20.

For the information of the taxpayers all State refunds to the treasury of Acushnet tend to offset the annual taxes placed upon this municipality by the Commonwealth.

Classes in Adult Alien Education were discontinued in the spring of 1939 because insufficient funds were available to carry out the program. However, this type of education will be resumed in January 1940. I quote section 9-A of Chapter 69, General Laws which covers Massachusetts Legislation for Adult Immigrant Education:

Upon the application for enrollment of twenty or more residents eighteen years of age or over, the school committee of any city or town shall furnish classes for instruction described in section 9 for a period of not less than forty sessions during the current or following school year; except that any class in which the attendance falls below the number of fifteen persons shall be discontinued at the discretion of the school commmittee of the city or town by which said class is conducted.

A petition seeking resumption of such classes with thirtyfive signatures attached was received by the local school committee and duly recognized.

Our eighth grade enrollment was so large at the Parting Ways School in September, 1939 that it was necessary to once again form an eighth grade at the Long Plain School. This action was easily accomplished because no first graders entered the Long Plain School last fall. Grades 7 and 8 are taught by Miss Anna Orlowski. Grades 4, 5, and 6 are instructed by Miss Anna Zajac. Mrs. Frances Gifford has grades 2 and 3. The school population is the same at present in all schools as it was one year ago.

I am satisfied that a reasonable education progress is being experienced by the children of Acushnet. More visits from parents and friends are herewith solicited. During Education Week it was very gratifying to note the large number of visitors who accepted a direct invitation to call upon our classes. In my opinion every week in the school year is truly an education week and should be regarded as such. The best way to determine what one's child is doing in his studies is to observe his application in the classroom. A workable harmony is fostered through a close cooperation between parents and teachers.

An Acushnet Teachers' Association has recently been formed which is affiliated with the Massachusetts Teachers' Federation. Much worthwhile educational material has been received by the staff and there exists an evident enthusiam among members. Officers are as follows: President, Miss Hilda Lete, Vice-president, Miss Anna Orlowski, Treasurer, Mrs. Mildred Meade, Secretary, Mrs. Yvonne Parker. The Executive Committee consists of five members representing the respective schools and including the president. Serving in this capacity are Miss Hilda Leite, Miss Anne Cox, Miss Stacia Skoczolek, Miss Sylvia Fleish and Mrs. Frances Gifford.

In my annual report for 1938 I predicted that world peace would be put to a terrific test before anything resembling universal tranquility could emerge. That prediction has materialized with all its suffering and horror. Nearly all of the continents of Europe and Asia are at war. Undoubtedly those nations which are still neutral will be drawn into the maelstrom of destructive chaos and widespread desolation. The cost in human life and financial resources cannot be measured The future certainly looks dark and dreary but it is my attitude that the people of the United States have much to be thankful for. I am still optimistic concerning the fate of liberty and freedom as we know it. Victory will eventuate for the democracies regardless of the number of years duration of this conflict. We are endeavoring to impress an effective sense of true patriotism upon our school children in order to better equip them to resist the inroads of undesirable'isms'.

The Trust Fund Commissioners have again aided the cause of education in a material way through purchase of books. I am grateful for their consideration.

It is with much satisfaction that I recognize the consistent support of all School Department employees. Solidarity of purpose is clearly revealed throughout the year. The success of any school is directly dependent upon the cooperative enterprise of school officials, principals, teachers, pupils and the community.

It is with a deep feeling of regret that I comment upon the passing of Mr. Edgar B. Cormier in September 1939. He served the Town of Acushnet faithfully as a member of the School Committee for more than seven years resigning to make h.s home in New Bedford in January 1939.

In conclusion may I express my appreciation of the friendly spirit and helpful assistance so characteristic of the School Committee<sup>-</sup> and townspeople of Acushnet.

## REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE AND SCHOOL PHYSICIAN 1939

ALBERT F. FORD Superintendent of School Acushnet, Massachusetts.

As we review another year's work, we realize more than ever that each year brings varied problems.

Our greatest need at present is at least some dental work, especially extractions.

Decayed teeth with their allies of abcesses, neuralgia, indigestion and malnutrition are a much more formidable enemy than original decaying teeth, also we find a few cases of serious tonsil and polypoid conditions. Families cannot pay even the very low cost of operation and there is no free clinic.

In presenting this report we wish to thank parents, school committee Superintendent and teachers for their valuable cooperation, and ask for its continuance during the coming.year.

In addition to a careful physical examination the first of the year, the following work has been done:---

Visits to pre-school children	224
Visits to children attending school	184
Consultation with Superintendent	
Interviews with teachers	12
interviews with teachers	20

Individual pupil inspections were made monthly in all schools.

Sanitary inspections were made at various intervals and conditions have been very satisfactory.

The Audiometer equipment which is used for testing hearing was loaned by the State and 599 children took advantage of the opportunity.

Eyes and teeth were examined, and a large number of individuals were found to possess faulty eyesight and alarmingly poor teeth.

We are trying hard to interest parents and pupils in preventive dentistry, for it is essential that the first teeth be properly cared for if a permanent set of latter teeth is to be expected.

An epidemic of chicken pox was experienced in the Spring at the Mason W. Burt and Parting Ways Schools.

The Chadwick Clinic was held March 24, 1939 and 33 children were examined for presence of Tuberculosis.

Vaccination of young people was carried out from Aug. 2, 1939 to September 6. Children being vaccinated during the above specified period numbered 75.

Mental Health investigations were made in 17 cases, each being tested by State authorities.

Toxoid treatments 86.

Proceeds from sale of Bristol County Tuberculosis seals afforded three young people the privilege of attending the Health Camp at Attleboro for one month. A decided gain in physique resulted.
