REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

To the Citizens of the Town of Acushnet:

The Board organized on March 13, 1944 as follows: Mr. Henry L. Guilbeault was re-appointed Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, Old Age Assistance, and Public Welfare. Miss Mary Viera was re-appointed clerk of the Board. Meetings are held each Monday evening at 8 p. m. in the Selectmen's office.

The Town of Acushnet is at the present time in the best financial condition it has been for many years, with a cash account of \$94,000. Of this amount \$25,000 being invested in U. S. Treasury Bonds. Our outstanding debt is now only \$5,600.

However, it is the Board's desire and our plea, that the inhabitants and tax payers of Acushnet still maintain the present tax rate of \$35.00 per thousand, in this way building up a reserve for future needs.

Due to the high cost of printing this year, the Board of Selectmen have decided to eliminate as much unnecessary printing as possible in the town reports.

We wish to express our appreciation for the assistance and cooperation given us by the citizens and the town departments during the past year.

REPORT OF SCHOOL PHYSICIAN AND SCHOOL NURSE

Mr. Albert F. Ford,

Superintendent of Schools,

Acushnet, Mass.

My dear Mr. Ford.

The school physician and school nurse respectfully present the following report for the year 1944:

At the opening of schools in September, the regular physical examinations were begun and carried out as rapidly as possible.

The predominating feature of these examinations was the great number of severely diseased teeth found throughout the schools. Only a little over ten percent of the children had teeth partially corrected or in fair condition. The result shows in reduced resistance, increased susceptibility to colds and other diseases and a marked reduction in the physical appearance of the children.

We therefore feel that some attention to teeth is imperative.

War conditions and attendant evils have made dentistry very hard to secure and it puts an increased duty upon us to make more effort to secure some definite program of correction for this trouble. We hope we may secure an allotment of funds to permit at least relief for the worst cases.

The fact that both parents have, because of war and war work been absent from home to an extent that has been reflected in the physical condition of the children, bears on the present situation.

Valuable first aid kits were purchased by the school department as replacements for worn out units. Much effective use is being made of this equipment.

We appreciate most heartily the complete cooperation of the School Committee, the Superintendent, and of the teachers as on them depends the daily supervision of the hygienic habits of our children.

The failure of parents and physicians to notify the Health Board of contagious diseases in the town, has made it hard to control the spread of infectious diseases of children and during the coming year we shall endeavor to have this condition remedied.

Diphtheria innoculations were carried out in the Spring and in the Fall. In spite of a marked increase of diphtheria in the state, our record has been clear for over ten years, and we were one of the first towns to go one hundred percent into immunization for diphtheria.

The sudden passing last May of Miss Margaret Duxbury is deeply regretted by her associates in the field of Public Health.

Article 1. To see if the Town will vote to determine the compensation which each Town Officer will receive and make an appropriation therefor.
